## DON'T FORGET TO VOTE!

Much attention has been paid to the U.S. Senate and Congressional seats in the upcoming November election. Of similar importance to those in the animal advocate world is the election of Clark County Commissioners. It is the Commission that has been most involved in passing spay and neuter legislation, feral cat ordinances, and all matter of issues pertaining to the care and ownership of companion animals. This year, depending on what happens with the Governor's race, there could be a change in the majority of the County Commission. Three of the seven commission seats are up for election: (1) District E Chris Giunchigliani and (2) District F Susan Brager are both term-limited, and (3) District G the current Commissioner, James Gibson, was appointed and is running for election. District A Steve Sisolak is running for governor and depending on what happens in that race, a fourth commissioner could be appointed. Commissioner Giunchigliani has been a big supporter of animal issues and will be sorely missed.

The following information is provided to assist you in informing yourself when deciding how to vote. Remember that the Las Vegas Valley Humane Society, as a 501 c 3 tax exempt organization, cannot recommend how to vote; also, be cautious of animal organizations that do make those recommendations. Know your candidates.
